
End-of-Program Review 2019-20

Arts in all Programs

(For the purposes of this survey, "Arts" includes visual arts, performing arts, and moving images. In responding to this survey, Art History should be included under Humanities instead of Art.)

The presence (Extensively, Moderately or A little) of Arts in programs did not change much, 47% this year compared to 45% the previous year. The most common fields of Arts taught in programs that included Art were: 2D (drawing, painting, printmaking) (27%), Performing Arts (16%), and Media Arts (11%).


There was subtantial drop in the presence of Arts in Upper Division program, only 19% compared to 59% the previous year.
