What if Spring Quarter Doesn't Start the Way You Planned?

It happens sometimes -- the program you thought would be perfect turns out not as you expected; you didn't get off the waitlist into the program you wanted; you were late or missed the first class meeting and faculty gave away your seat, etc. The steps you take during the first few days of the quarter can make all the difference!

- **If you need help making a new plan, come to [Academic and Career Advising](#) as soon as possible!** We will be taking drop-ins during Week One from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm. Please note that staffing may be limited from 8:00-9:00 am and during the noon hour.
- **If you have doubts about whether your program is right for you, or whether you can handle the workload, please talk with your faculty immediately!** [Faculty](#) can give you a sense of how the material will flow and develop over the quarter, and the resources available to support you with the work.
- **If you're feeling like the program is basically OK but doesn't completely align with your interests, talk with your faculty and with [Academic and Career Advising](#)!** They can talk with you about how to make the most of the experience and how the program can benefit you in ways you perhaps hadn't thought of.
- **If you're certain you need to change your registration, act fast!** Programs that have space often don't accept students after Wednesday or Thursday of Week One.
- **If you need to drop a program or class, act fast!** You need to drop your registration on-line by 4:00 pm on April 7th in order to receive a 100% refund. Dropping during Week Two requires a paper form and you'll get a 50% tuition refund. [The Registration website](#) has lots of excellent info to help you.
- **If you receive financial aid, please talk with a [Financial Aid](#) staff member!**

Wheelchair Ramp & Walkway Closure Between RAD and Main Campus

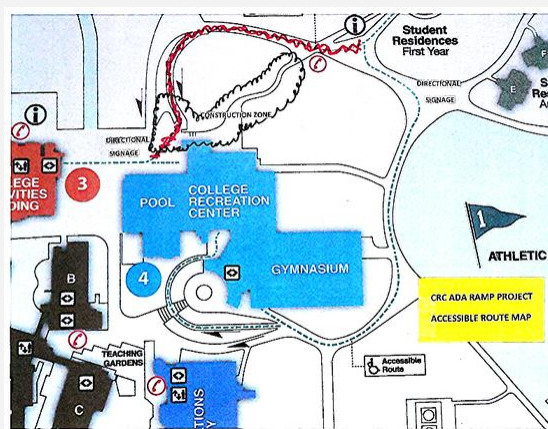
March 27 - June 9

On March 27 work began to replace and reconfigure the wheelchair ramp and pedestrian walkway that serves as the primary connection between campus housing and main campus. The length of the project will be dependent on weather, but is expected to be completed by June 9. **Signs will be posted with available alternate routes. Accessible routes include:**

- The pedestrian walkway/ramp at the CRC amphitheater
- The elevator in the CRC lobby is available for use during CRC business hours: Monday-Friday 7:00 am to 9:00 pm (Wednesdays until 11:00 pm), Saturday 10:00 am to 2:00 pm, and Sunday 5:00 pm to 9:00 pm.
- The maintenance vehicle access roads adjacent to the COM and the construction project will remain open during this project.
