**Level of Education of Primary Caregivers**

Students were asked to indicate the highest level of education for up to four primary caregivers who raised them. Caregivers could be fathers, mothers, step-fathers, step-mothers, and/or other adults who cared for them while growing up. The chart below shows the percentage of respondents in Tribal Programs within each category. Please note that percentages do not add up to 100%, as some respondents may fit within more than one category. The largest proportion of respondents in Tribal Programs had no primary caregiver who had earned at least a Bachelor's degree (82.8%). Conversely, 17.2% of the respondents had at least one primary caregiver who had earned at least a bachelor's degree or more. A total of 6.9% of the respondents had no primary caregiver who had completed high school or had earned a GED and 27.6% had no primary caregiver who had gone to college.
