Evergreen Student Experience Survey 2006
Tribal: Reservation-based/Community-Determined Programs

Primary Area of Study or Concentration and Ability to Study in Field of Interest

Students were asked to respond to the question: "What is your primary field of study or concentration at Evergreen?" The open-ended responses to this question were coded into the Classification for Instructional Programs (CIP) 2000 codes. Some respondents wrote in more than one field of study, so percentages do not add up to 100%. The greatest proportion of respondents from the Tribal Programs indicated fields of study within Area, Ethnic, Cultural and Gender Studies (24.1%), Liberal Arts and Sciences (24.1%), Education (17.2%), and Social Sciences (17.2%).

Students were asked to indicate how satisfied they are with their ability to study what they are interested in at Evergreen. About 79% of respondents in Tribal Programs indicated that they were "Quite a Bit" or "Very" satisfied that they can study what they are interested in at Evergreen.

Mean = 3.18, Median = 3.00. One respondent skipped this question.

There were six respondents who indicated that they were only "A Little Bit" or "Moderately" satisfied that they can study what they are interested in at Evergreen. The primary area of interest or concentration (categorized into CIP 200 codes) were: Education (N=3), Area, Ethnic, Cultural and Gender Studies (N=1), Business, Management, Marketing and Related Support Services (N=1), Liberal Arts and Sciences (N=1), Natural Resources and Conservation (N=1). Seven areas are listed, as one student indicated that her/his primary area of interest is in more than one field.
