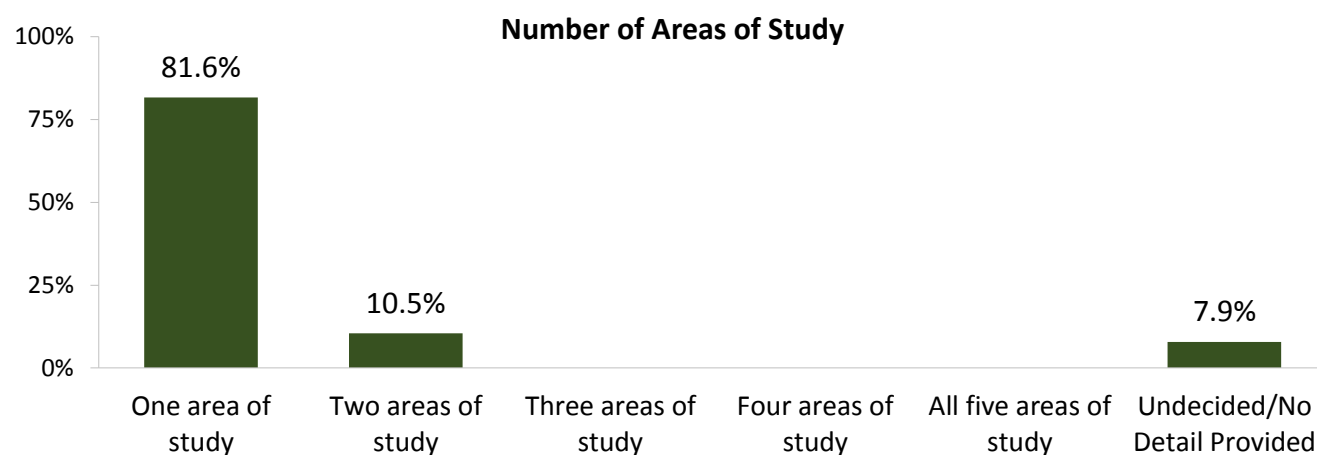
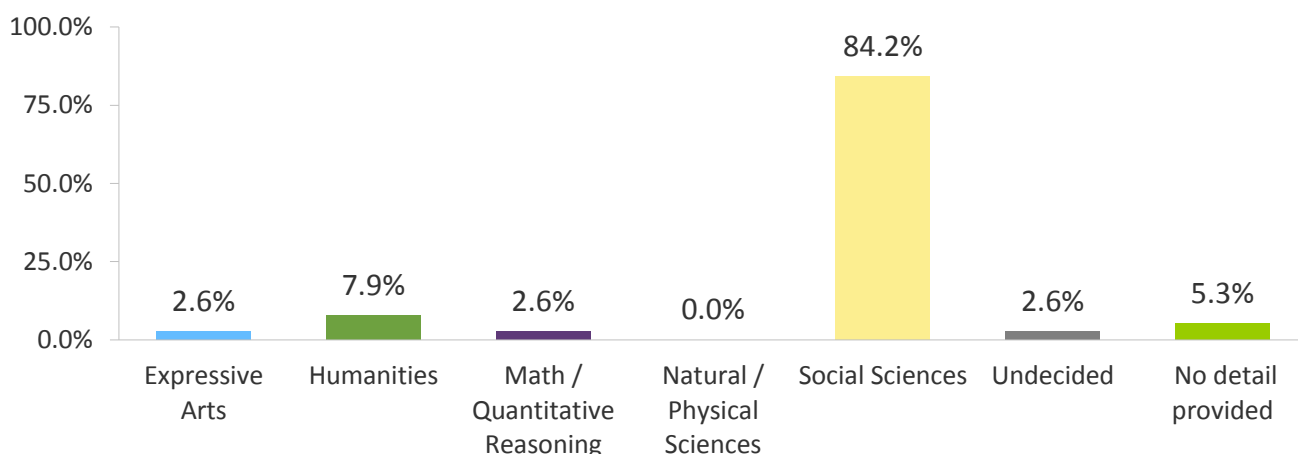



































Describe your primary field(s) of study or concentration at Evergreen?

Students were asked to describe their primary field or fields of study at Evergreen. Some 84.2% of respondents indicated they were studying Social Sciences, 7.9% were studying Humanities, 2.6% were studying Expressive Arts, 2.6% Math/Quantitative Reasoning, 5.3% provided no detail and 2.6% were undecided. There were no Tacoma campus respondents studying Natural/Physical Sciences. Students were allowed to choose more than one field, so the categories will not sum to 100%. Some 81.6% of Tacoma Campus respondents indicated they were concentrating on one area of study, while 10.5% indicated two areas of study, and 7.9% were undecided or provided no detail.
