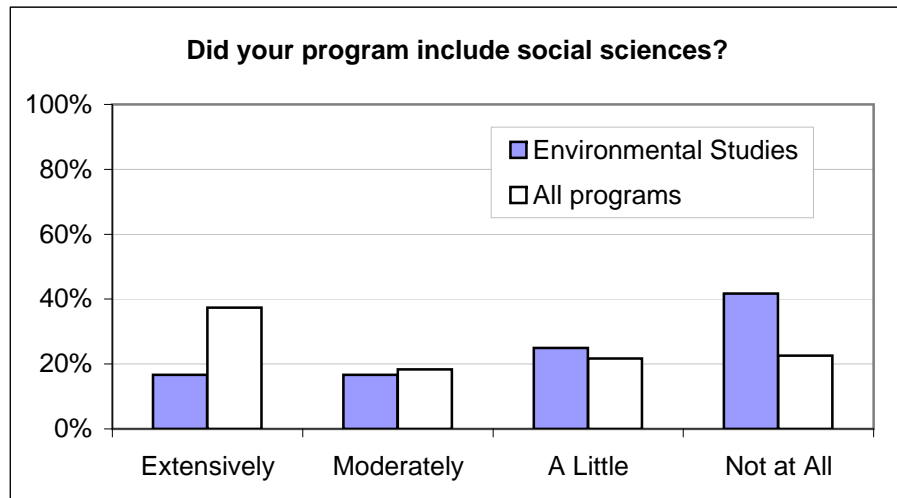

Sustainable Practice	Extensively	I introduced some key concepts in sustainability through the lens of anthropology. I talked about cultural change over time, and subsistence practices of early humans as compared to now. We spoke about social justice and climate change issues, especially about how our activities affect others in the world, and how climate change affects some cultures disproportionately to their own consumption and carbon emissions. We talked about sweat shops and monocropping in other countries and our links to them through our consumption and lifestyle choices. We looked at psychological theories that help explain why behavioral change is difficult, and why people stand by when they see something is wrong.	X	X
