One of the writers whose works we studied was also very concerned about the social justice and community organizing and political aspects of sustainability.
Thinking Through Craft: Metal	A Little	Responsible use of natural resources and materials required in the field of fine metalworking.
Animal Others in Image and Text	A Little	Ethical treatment of animals, individual students learned about sustainability and conservation issues in the process of learning about the animals they focused on in their studies.
Art of Mosaic	A Little	Art materials - Sustainable Practices, Recycling
