<p>Student Conduct Student Voice survey- Spring 2010</p> <p>Data suggests that Students' Awareness of the Student Code of Conduct:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 93% are aware that Evergreen has a Student Code of Conduct 76% are aware of a conflict mediation process 63% know where to find a copy of the Student Code of Conduct 52% report having read the Student Code of Conduct 49% report having read the Social Contract <p>Students' Experience with the Student Conduct Process: Because not every student surveyed was involved in misconduct, only 42 respondents participated in the questions involving the student conduct process; all were allegedly involved in non-academic misconduct, with 69% reporting that they were found in violation of one or more policies.</p> <p>Students reported the following to a statistically significantly higher degree than their national peers:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> They were treated fairly They understood the rationale for the decision, whether they agreed or not They believed the sanctions were educational nature The conduct officer explained the importance of the alleged broken rule Their experience helped them recognize their rights, responsibilities, and privileges as a member of The campus community 	<p>Students Experience with the Student Conduct Process reported that the amount of weeks passed between receiving notification of an alleged violation and your being found responsible or not was as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 31.71% Less than one week 36.59% Within three weeks 9.76% Four to six weeks 21.95% More than six weeks <p>When students were asked to indicate their level of agreement with the following statements: - I know the steps in the student conduct process, students reported the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 12.38% Strongly agree 16.09% Somewhat agree 22.28% Neither agree nor disagree 17.82% Somewhat disagree 22.03% Strongly disagree 9.41% NA/Does not apply 	<p>Assistant to the Vice President of Student Conduct will develop training and conversations around timeliness of communication between conduct officers and students who have been summons to appear in a conduct meeting.</p> <p>Review of Student Conduct website as the current website does not provide the viewer easy access or understanding of the student conduct process, as well as their rights and responsibilities as a student.</p>	<p>Assess one month's worth of conduct cases utilizing the Incident Reporting System to determine what the turnaround of communication is between conduct officer and student.</p> <p>Research best practices with website marketing to provide a user friendly experience.</p>	<p>Assistant to the Vice President of Student Conduct- Fall 2012</p>	<p>Research the possibly to assess students experience post conduct meeting to gain a greater number or respondents to many of the questions currently being asked in the Student Voice survey.</p>

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
