Motions

The approval of the minutes of the June 25 meeting was postponed until the next meeting.

Mr. Saunders reviewed the terms of the bids received from the Olympia Branch of the Seattle-First National Bank and the Olympia Branch of The National Bank of Commerce of Seattle, for the interim loan for Evergreen's fall 1971 supplemental housing.

Mr. Saunders moved acceptance of the offer made by the Olympia Branch of the National Bank of Commerce of Seattle for interim financing for fall 1971 supplemental housing subject only to the understanding that interest paid on time certificates of deposit covering unused funds deposited with the National Bank of Commerce will be the usual and standard rates. Seconded by Mr. Hadley and passed.

President McCann recommended Board approval of an interfund loan to finance activities of the office of the Director of College Activities and Recreation until revenues from the Services and Activities Fee are received in the fall.

Mr. Saunders moved approval of an interfund loan of \$7,150 from the General Fund-Local (Fund 149) to the College Activities Fund (Fund 522) to cover operating expenses to be incurred by the office of the Director of College Activities and Recreation for the period beginning July 1, 1971 and ending October 31, 1971. Seconded by Mr. Hadley and passed.

Mr. McCann reviewed stand of the Veterans Administration regarding VA assistance to Evergreen students and recommended Board action to assure VA administration approval.

Mr. Hadley moved that The Evergreen State College hereby adopt and maintain a policy, applicable only for the quarter or those quarters at the beginning of which the College has not received notice of its recognition by the Commission on Higher Schools of the Northwest Association of Secondary and Higher Schools as a "candidate for accreditation," for the refund of the unused portion of tuition, fees, and other charges in the event a veteran attending the College fails to enter the educational program or withdraws or is discontinued therefrom at any time prior to completion and should this contingency happen, the amount charged to the veteran for tuition, fees, and other charges for a portion of the educational program shall not exceed the approximate pro-rata portion of the total charges for tuition, fees, and other charges that the length of the completed portion of the educational program bears to its total length. For the purposes of this resolution, the term "veteran" means only a person who has been on active federal service as a member of the armed military or naval forces of the United States and for whom the College must meet the requirements of Veterans Administration Regulation 14254 in order to qualify him for educational assistance by the Veterans Administration. Seconded by Mr. Saunders and passed.

The president recommended approval to increase the furniture budget for fall 1971 supplemental housing by \$12,000.

Mr. Hadley moved that the Board authorize an expenditure of \$72,000 for furniture for the fall 1971 supplemental housing units rather than \$60,000 as authorized in motion 71-36 passed by the Board on June 10, 1971. Seconded by Mr. Saunders and passed.

Mr. McCann reported on part-time resident Vietnam veteran tuition and fees and recommended keeping Evergreen's fees consistent with the other colleges.

Mr. Saunders moved that the tuition and fee schedules applicable to academic years 1971-72 and 1972-73 for part-time resident Vietnam veterans adopted at the May 19, 1971 Board meeting be amended to the following (the entire part-time schedule is shown for comparison purposes):

RESOLUTION NO. 71-7

A RESOLUTION of the Board of Trustees of The Evergreen State College authorizing interim financing for Fall 1971 Supplemental Housing and accepting an offer therefor.

WHEREAS, The Evergreen State College, an institution of higher learning of the State of Washington, hereinafter referred to as the "college", is undertaking a construction project at its Olympia, Washington campus consisting of nineteen duplex residential units and a laundry building to house approximately 152 students, and the appurtenant furnishings, equipment and facilities thereof, which residential units and laundry building are hereinafter referred to as "Fall 1971 Supplemental Housing" or "this project"; and

WHEREAS, Application has been filed by the College with the United States of America, acting through the Department of Housing and Urban Development, for a loan or interest subsidy to provide financing for this project, but it is not known at this time whether the federal loan or interest subsidy will be obtained, and in any event because of federal practice, it will not produce funds until the construction of this project is substantially or totally completed, and since if financing assistance from the federal government is not obtained, it will be necessary for the college to obtain long term financing of this project without federal assistance, and in order to initiate construction and to have the project ready for occupancy and use beginning with the fall term of 1971, as is necessary, the college now requires interim financing and has received the offer which is set forth below:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Board of Trustees of The Evergreen State College:

1. In order to provide interim financing to pay the cost of construction, equipping and betterment of Fall 1971 Supplemental Housing and any cost of other appurtenances necessary for the construction and equipping of this project, the college will borrow the sum of \$792,000.00 through the issuance of notes in accordance with the terms of the offer set forth below. The college agrees to go forward with the construction and equipping of this project as soon as practicable, and to complete it as soon as reasonably practicable. The note or notes issued shall be paid from the proceeds of the sale of bonds issued for long term financing, or, if long term bond financing is not available at the maturity of the note or notes now to be issued, from the proceeds of the sale of another series of notes or from issuance of other evidences of indebtedness.
