**Review of minutes**

**Announcements**

A student walkout is scheduled for noon on October 7, 2010. Flyers indicate the walkout will rally on red square at noon. Les P. will send out an email to the campus community and will be out on red square to talk to the participants during the rally. This event is connected to a broader national walkout.

**Sex Offender Notification**

Art C. distributed a copy of a sex offender campus bulletin. Campus policy describes the level of notification made to the campus community.

Decisions and Actions

**Enrollment Recommendation for Winter**

Steve H. distributed an update on fall registration. He recommended that the college close applications for winter admission as of Friday October 1, which was the published priority date. He noted that we are running about 115 applications ahead, compared to this time last year. He indicated that he would like to send the message that the priority date is meaningful. Offers will be extended through mid to late October for winter admission. As more students graduate, more space will be available for spring admissions. Priority will be given to transfer students with 90+ credits in both winter and spring. Recruitment efforts are stepping up in California and Austin. Continuing efforts are being made in the Northeast, Chicago, and DC. New efforts are being made in the Southeast (Florida), Colorado, and Albuquerque. An enrollment and retention report will be prepared for the Board of Trustees meeting on November 17, 2010.

Decisions and Actions

- Admissions will adhere to the published priority date for spring admissions. Spring admissions are closed for spring 2010 as of Friday, October 1, 2010.
- Prepare enrollment report for the BOT meeting on Wednesday, November 17, 2010 (Steve H.).

**Campus Conversations about the Israeli/Palestine Conflict**

The GSU recently had a meeting and endorsed the student vote on Caterpillar and divestment. Lee H. said that she met GSU members interested in this issue and invited them to meet with her. They have not yet made an appointment. She will connect them with the BOG investment committee. Some community members have expressed the view that only one side of the issue is being heard. Hillel would like to have the opportunity to present their side to the Board of Trustees. The group discussed next steps. Suggestions for next steps include: have discussions with the GSU; provide campus wide communication (communication about the process and steps should include foundation investments, college investments, caterpillar, and the responsibilities of educators for dialog); have a campus wide forum (give information

and hear from community); consult with the GSU about the best way to have the conversation with the campus community; and partner with academics. Questions included: How do we educate the board on these issues?; What would be the best venue for conversations on divestment and the conflict itself?; and What is the role of the college?

Decisions and Actions

- Continue the conversation on the Israeli/Palestine conflict this week. Add to the VP agenda (VPs).
