Please read carefully before completing the verification process. We cannot review your financial aid file until we have received all the requested information. Incomplete or missing documents may delay your financial aid award.

If you have already submitted 2020 income information for your 2022-2023 file, contact our office.
□ I have filed taxes and have or will use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool to transfer my tax information to my FAFSA. This means you have successfully transferred data from the IRS to your FAFSA. To do this, logged into your FAFSA, under the income section you will be asked a series of questions to see if you are able to transfer the information. If you are able, the site will take you from your FAFSA to the IRS site. You must use the address listed on your 2021 taxes and must list the main person who filed the return for the tool to work properly. Be sure to click transfer! The site will then take you back to your FAFSA, but you will not be able to see what information was transfer. That's ok! Do not change the information.
□ I have filed taxes and I will provide a copy of my 2021 Tax Return Transcript. You may go to the IRS Website at www.irs.gov and click on "Get My Tax Record," then choose the transcript online or by mail. You need to use the address listed on your tax return and list the main person who filed the return for this option to work properly. You may also fill out Form 4506-T and send that to the IRS to get a copy by mail. If you are not able to obtain one, we can accept a sign copy of your 1040 form. If you amended your taxes after you filed, we will also need a signed copy of your 1040X.
□ I filed a 2021 tax return and have some income from self-employment and I will provide a 2021 Tax Return Transcript from the IRS and copies of all Schedule K-1 (Form 1065) and W2's if applicableIf you do not have W2's, submit a signed statement confirming your wages with this form. If you earned more than \$400 in self-employment, you must file taxes.
□ I am not required to, and will not file a 2021 tax return, but I did work and will provide copes of my 2021 W2's, and a Verification of Non-Filing Letter form the IRS dated on or after October 1, 2022. • You may go to the IRS Website at www.irs.gov and click on "Get My Tax Record," then choose the transcript online or by mail. You may also fill out Form 4506-T and send that to the IRS to get a letter by mail. If you are unable to obtain one, please contact our office.
□ I did not work in 2021 and will provide a "Verification or Non-Filing" from the IRS. If you did not work and did not file, we are required to get a Letter of Non-Filing from the IRS. Your financial aid file will be considered incomplete. You may go to the IRS Website at www.irs.gov and click on "Get My Tax Record," then choose the transcript online or by mail. You may also fill out Form 4506-T and send that to the IRS to get a letter by mail for you are unable to obtain one, please contact our office.
