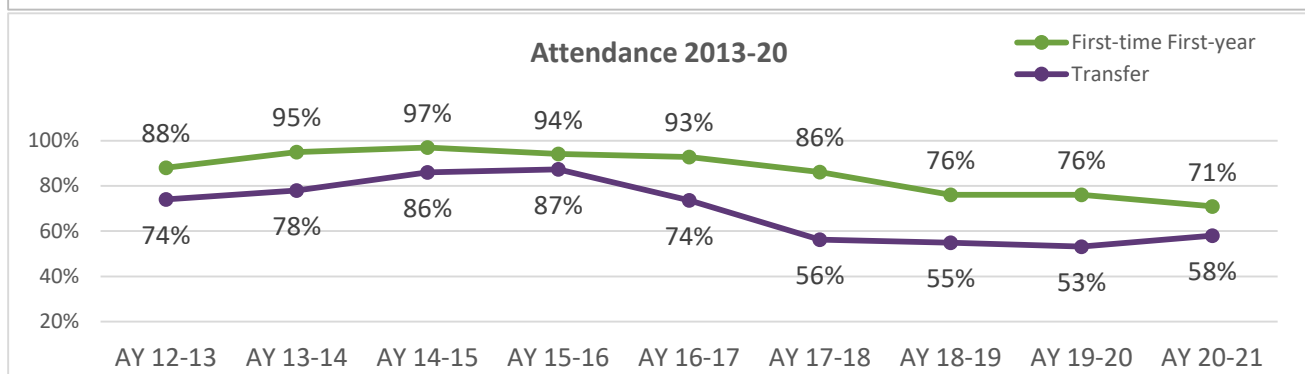

Summary: Overall, 62% of new degree-seeking students at the Olympia campus attended at least one A.S. O-week session, up from 59% in Fall 2019. First-time, First-year attendance at Academic Statement Orientation dropped 5 percentage points from Fall 2019 to Fall 2020. Transfer participation rose 5 percentage points, 58% in 2019 compared to 53% in 2020.

WA State Transfer students were less likely to attend O-week sessions compared to Non-resident Transfers and all First-time, First-years. Non-resident First-time, First-years had the highest attendance rate. There were 10 Returning Greeners who attended Academic Statement Sessions.

Low Income and First-generation students were less likely to attend sessions. Multi-racial students had higher attendance rates. Students of color other than Multi-racial students had lower attendance rates. Males were less likely than females or sex x students to attend sessions. On average, students who opted not to attend had lower high school GPAs. Students with conditional admission status had lower attendance rates.
