

Summary: Overall, 62% of new degree-seeking students at the Olympia campus attended at least one A.S. O-week session, down from 68% in Fall 2017. First-time, First-year attendance at Academic Statement Orientation dropped from Fall 2017 to Fall 2018 from 86% to 76%. Transfer participation stayed roughly the same, 55% in 2018 compared to 56% in 2017. While most students opt for the daytime sessions, 22% attended weekend or evening sessions.

WA State Transfer students were less likely to attend O-week sessions compared to Non-resident Transfers and all First-time, First-years. Non-resident First-time, First-years had the highest attendance rate. There were 4 Returning Greeners who attended Academic Statement Sessions.

Females, Black non-Hispanic, and Multiracial non-Hispanic students had higher attendance rates. Veterans, Native American students, First-generation students, students with unknown race/ethnicity, and men had lower attendance rates. On average, students who opted not to attend had lower prior high school and college GPAs. Students with conditional admission status had lower attendance rates.
