

CULC Minutes 9/20/10

Introductions and Approval of Minutes: Minutes from May 17, 2010 and May 24, 2010 are approved as is.

Sukkah (Hillel—Evergreen Student Group):

Students for the student organization Hillel would like to build a 10'x12' sukkah on Red Square from Sept 21-29, 2010. The structure will be provided by a Rabbi from the community. They would occupy the tent at all times until 2:00am when Police Services gives them the last call. They would provide signs and educate the campus community about their culture and holiday. The structure would be on the bricks of Red Square. It will not be placed in the Fire Lane. Mark suggests putting it between the sycamores and green patch on the eastern side of Red Square. Robyn or Rich Davis needs to inspect and approve the structure before students can start to inhabit it. There will be no open fires or propane light in the sukkah; there may be battery powered flashlights. If there needs to be extra material added to the sukkah, there is money in their student organization budget to cover it. The application is provisionally approved until Rich or Robyn inspects the structure.

Other Items:

Organic Farm Master Plan Update:

Paul Smith met with Paul Przybylowicz on the Organic Farm vision and Master Plan update. Przybylowicz asks that the CLUC review the possible organic farm visions and collect what they like and don't like about the plans; also trouble-shooting should be done for the problems members have with the plans. Przybylowicz is currently focusing on setting programmatic goals with other Organic Farm faculty. Both Pauls think the timeline for deciding and updating the Organic Farm Master Plan vision doesn't need to be immediate. The next project at the farm would be to renovate the existing structures during the 2011-13 biennium. In 2013-15 a project may be initiated depending on funding to expand arable lands. Smith would like to get campus approval on the vision, so that plans can be presented to the Board of Trustees during Spring Quarter of 2011. Przybylowicz was thinking of starting community meetings to discuss the plans in November 2010. Sarah Pedersen will see if Paul Przybylowicz will come and speak to the CLUC about the Organic Farm vision during the October CLUC meeting.

Biomass Update:

Paul updates members on the Biomass feasibility plan and the concerns brought up by some people in the campus community. The CLUC asks what role they have in this

discussion. Paul said that if the project is approved the CLUC will need to approve the site location for the fuel storage structure.
