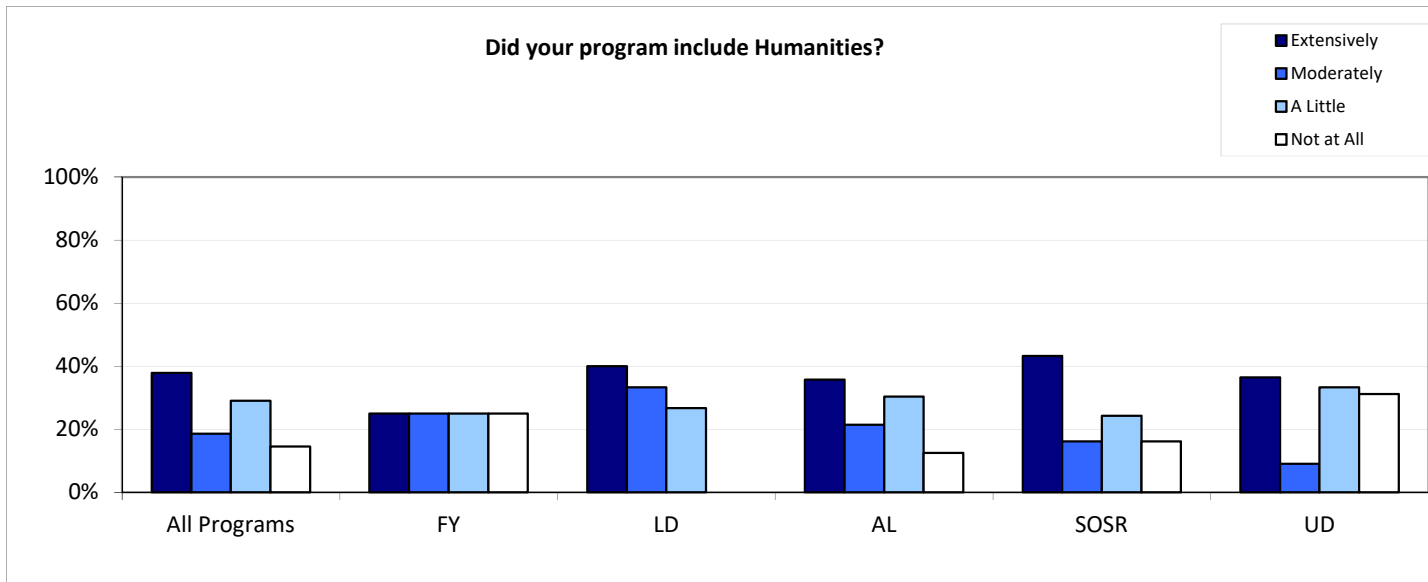


End-of-Program Review 2017-18

Humanities in all programs

The presence of Humanities in programs offered in 2017-18 stayed almost the same with 86% compared to 87% the previous year. The most common fields of Humanities taught in programs that included Humanities were: Writing (65%), History (40%), Literature (38%), Philosophy (36%), and Gender/Women's Studies (25%).

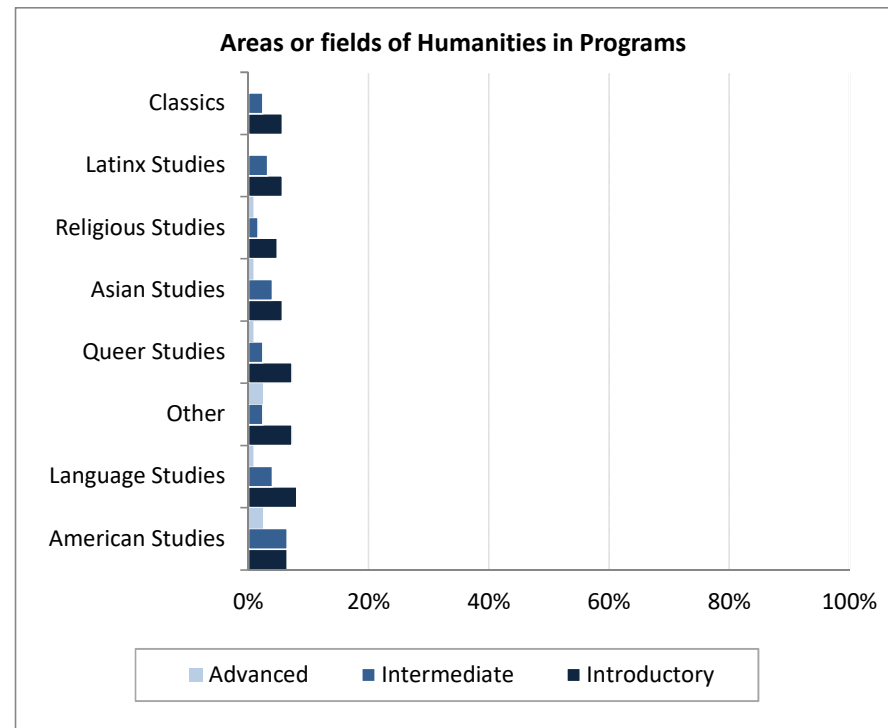
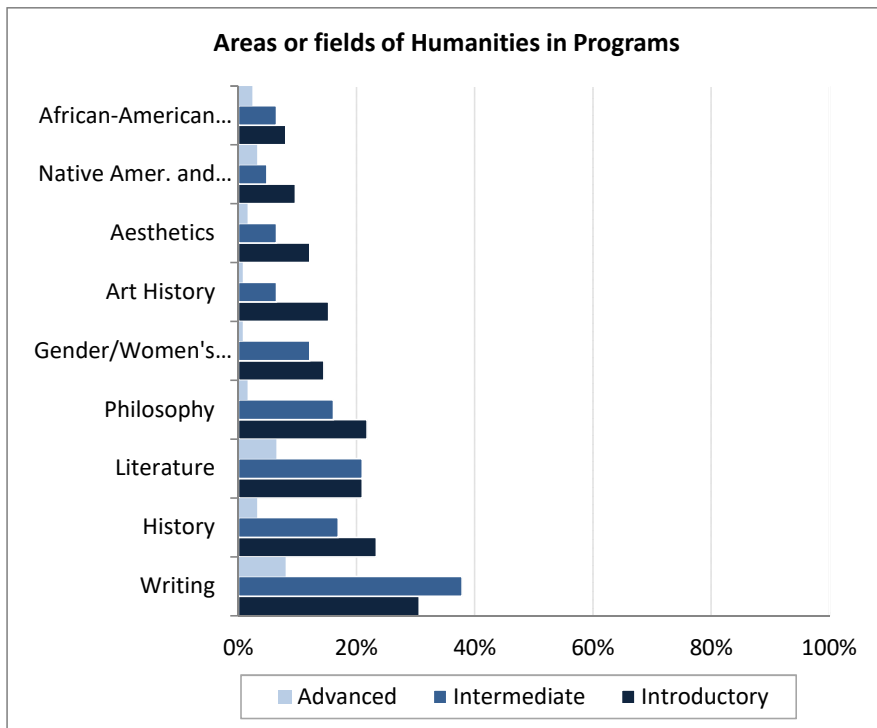
