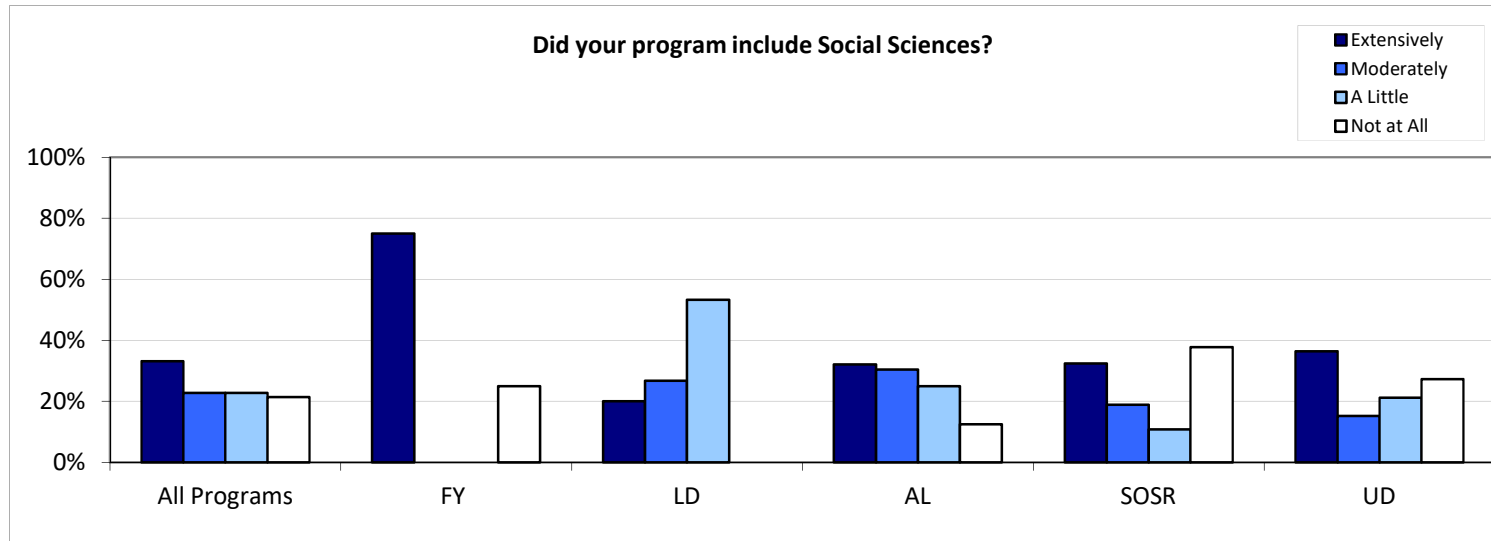


## End-of-Program Review 2017-18

### Social Sciences in all programs

The presence of Social Sciences in programs offered in 2017-18 decreased from 81% in the previous year to 79%. The most common fields of Social Sciences taught in programs that included this division were: Social Justice/Environmental Justice (51%), Sociology (29%) Political Economy/Science (27%), Communication (25%), and Psychology (24%).

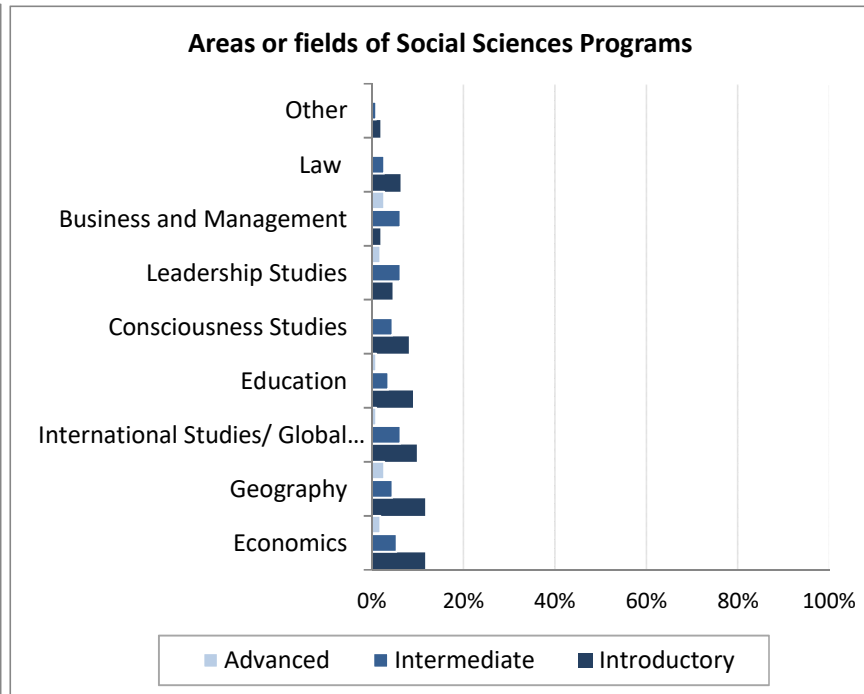
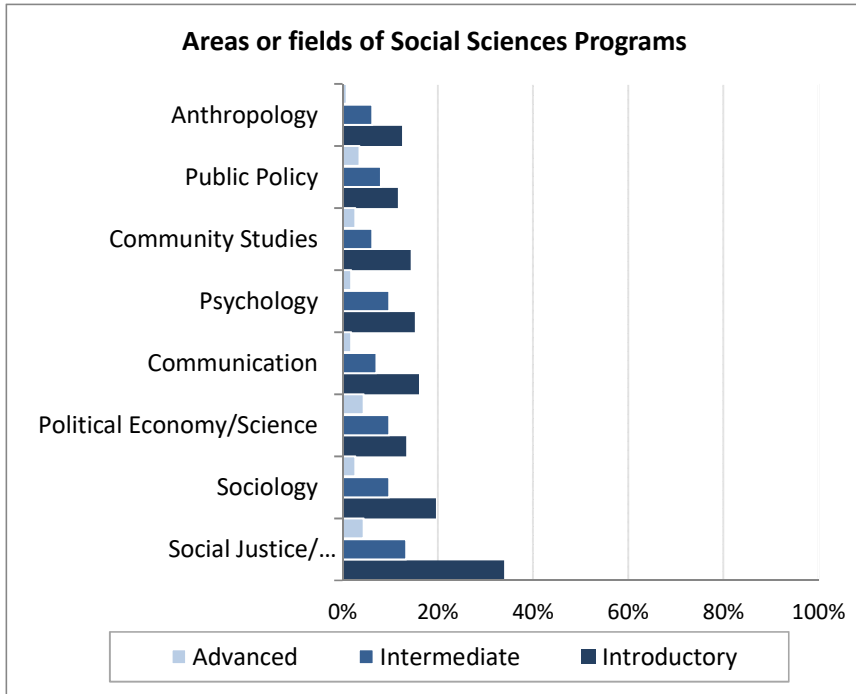
